Dying Matters Awareness Week: 8-14 May 2023

The Dying Matters campaign aims to create an open culture that talks about death and where people feel able to listen and support those who are planning for end of life, who are dying and who have been bereaved. The aim is to break

the stigma around death, to challenge preconceptions and to normalise public openness around death and dying. Did you know:

- Less than half of adults have made a will
- Around 30% of people have let someone know their funeral wishes
- Only 7% of us have written down wishes about the care we would want it we couldn't make decisions
- Only 25% of us have asked a family member about their end of life care wishes

Capacity Tracker- DHSC Mandatory Submission Reminder

A reminder to all CQC registered care homes and providers of domiciliary services, that the window will be opening this week for the mandated Department of Health and Social Care submission through the Capacity Tracker. All providers must complete the tracker at least once during this period at a condition of registration. The window this month falls between the **8 May** and **15 May**, and there are potential fines as a last resort for providers who do not update- so please be mindful of this. Further information on how the regulations will be enforced can be found through this link. A reminder this doesn't replace the need for more regular (preferably daily) usage to allow local authority and health partners to support providers. ICB Funded Tablet Scheme for Care Providers- Survey

We are currently reviewing our funded tablet scheme launched by the former Vale of York and North Yorkshire CCG's at the start of the pandemic- to provide Samsung Tab A devices for providers to support video calls with families/virtual consultation and MDT's with health services/access to training. As health professionals and families have now been able to enter care settings again for some time, and we know many providers now have their own tablet devices we are conducting a review of this scheme to determine the future of this scheme. Skills for Care and The Digitising Social Care Programme (a joint NHS/DHSC unit) invite you to the launch of the updated Digital Skills Framework.



It's structured around seven themes and aims to help employers and individuals working in adult social care to plan their learning and choose the right digital skills training for their needs. Adult Social Care Nurse Leadership Programme

This programme is aimed at Registered Nurses working in a Social Care service. You will be in a leadership role such as head of care, team leader, care coordinator, registered manager or deputy manager with a clinical lead. It is designed to support delegates to understand their leadership style and the impact this has through undertaking a 360 appraisal, delegates will be allocated an independent mentor to further develop their leadership and management skills. The workshop sessions will be interactive with presentations, discussions and exercises that will support the development of knowledge. Each session will include an Action Learning Set which will enable real time discussion and generate ideas and potential resolutions to issues.



Delegates will undertake a work based project to embed their learning.
