Capacity Tracker- DHSC Mandatory Submission Reminder

A reminder to all CQC registered care homes and providers of domiciliary services, that the window will be opening this week for the mandated Department of Health and Social Care submission through the Capacity Tracker. All providers must complete the tracker at least once during this period at a condition of registration. The window this month falls between the **8 July** and **14 July**, and there are potential fines as a last resort for providers who do not update- so please be mindful of this. A reminder this doesn't replace the need for more regular (preferably daily) usage to allow local authority and health partners to support providers. Adult Social Care Nurse Leadership Programme York and North Yorkshire



Adult Social Care Nurse Leadership Programme- NY+Y

Skills for Care has developed this programme to support registered nurses working in social care (who are in a leadership role) develop their leadership practice and enhance their personal and professional impact when managing teams. The programme is made up of five interactive workshops covering a range of leadership concepts and theories. These will enable participants to develop the required knowledge and skills to enhance their leadership practice when working across complex and often challenging systems. There will be presentations, discussions, and exercises to take part in, including 360 appraisals and workbased projects to embed learning and further support the development of leadership and management skills. We're offering 20 funded places to organisations based in York and North Yorkshire as well as a backfill payment of £1000 per participant to employers.
