Capacity Tracker- DHSC Mandatory Submission Reminder

A reminder to all CQC registered care homes and providers of domiciliary services, that the window will be opening this week for the mandated Department of Health and Social Care submission through the Capacity Tracker. All providers must complete the tracker at least once during this period at a condition of registration. The window this month falls between the **8 August** and **14 August**, and there are potential fines as a last resort for providers who do not update- so please be mindful of this. A reminder this doesn't replace the need for more regular (preferably daily) usage to allow local authority and health partners to support providers. This helps to reduce risks and supports a more personalised care approach. NHS Transformation Directorate's work, in partnership with Digital Social Care, aims to support the <u>Department of Health and Social Care</u>'s white paper (People at the Heart of Care) target of ensuring 80% of our registered care providers use electronic care planning solutions, by March 2024. Constipation can be a life—threatening issue for people with a learning disability who are at heightened risk from complications if it is left untreated. These resources have been created to help prevent, recognise and treat constipation in people with a learning disability. They are designed to be printed and used in home or care settings, facilitating conversations about constipation, and hopefully leading to swift treatment and improved outcomes for those people with a learning disability who are experiencing constipation.
