Dementia take-over











Guidance & Information

As Director of DHSC Adult Social Care Delivery, Claire Armstrong wrote in her <u>letter on 31 August</u> rollout of this year's Autumn/Winter Flu and COVID-19 vaccination delivery programme to begin on 11 September..

Both care home residents and social care staff will be offered Covid-19 and flu vaccinations and as with previous campaigns and in line with the Formal Notice, vaccination data will form part of the mandated collection. This will be the same fields as in previous years. Due to the dates the campaigns start, the first reporting window for this data will be **8 October 2023 to 16 October 2023**. It is especially useful for care home managers to update CT immediately following a vaccination team visit. We are adding the questions before the October window to support this.

We encourage all residents and staff to take up their autumn COVID-19 and flu vaccine. Eligible individuals can book and manage their COVID-19 - and flu - vaccination appointments online when the service becomes available

Flu and COVID-19 Vaccination- Resources for Care Providers

Communications resources now available to order to support winter flu and COVID-19 vaccinations for health and social care workers Printed materials to promote winter vaccinations for eligible frontline staff are now available to pre-order until **midnight Friday 8 September** and will be delivered to sites late September.

Printed materials can be ordered from the <u>Campaign Resource Centre</u>. Digital versions of these campaign assets will be available for download mid-September at the same link. This is a great opportunity for providers to receive, display and share in your settings to communicate the importance of vaccination for staff this autumn to protect them and those in your care.











Heat Alert

Heat-Health Alert issued

The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) and the Met Office have today (5 September) issued <u>an amber heat-health alert (HHA) in eight regions of England</u>. The regions included in the amber alert are East Midlands, East of England, London, North West and **Yorkshire and the Humber**.

The alert is currently in place from 12:00pm on 5 September to 9:00pm on 10 September. The Met Office has forecast temperatures exceeding 30°C.

Under the <u>HHA system introduced by UKHSA and the Met Office earlier this year</u>, an amber alert means that weather impacts are likely to be felt across the whole health service. At this level, we may begin to see some health impacts across the wider population, and an increase in risk to health for individuals aged over 65 years or those with pre-existing health conditions, including respiratory and cardiovascular diseases.











National Patient Safety Alert: Medical beds, trolleys, bed rails, bed grab handles and lateral turning devices: risk of death from entrapment or falls

The MHRA have shared a <u>national alert</u> following reports of death and entrapment relating to medical equipment. According to investigations, deaths were found to involve factors including inadequate risk assessment, maintenance issues and children and adults of small stature using beds which are designed for use by adults with typical body dimensions.

The alert requests a series of actions around maintenance, training and risk assessment.

NHS Industrial Action

The British Medical Association (BMA) have announced further dates for industrial action. The dates are:

Junior Doctors

20, 21 & 22 September 2023 & 2, 3 & 4 October 2023

Hospital Consultants

19 & 20 September 2023 & 2, 3, 4 & 5 October 2023

Care providers are advised to contact the Incident Command Centre in the event of a serious incident resulting in significant harm to residents or service users that relates to the industrial action so that intelligence can be gathered at ICB level. Industrial Action – Message for Providers

ICBs are already working with Local Resilience Forums (LRFs) and Local Authority partners to ensure all care homes are aware of industrial action dates with mitigating action and contingency where required. To avoid unnecessary hospital admission, consideration should be given to alternative community service offers which may include; localised Urgent Community Response services, District Nursing, Virtual Wards, Falls pick up services where clinically indicated.

For providers that have the service in place, we are encouraging providers to please use the Immedicare Telemedicine service where appropriate for any non-urgent non-999 situations, to help support services in prioritising calls requiring an emergency response. You are likely to receive quicker access to clinical support over this period by using the Immedicare Service where you have it in place. A document is available giving examples of when Immedicare can be used versus calling 999 or your GP Practice.

It's important that staff are familiar with how to use the service when required and we would encourage homes to support new starters in accessing training. A 5 minute training video is available on the clinical laptop itself, or Immedicare are able to provide either face to face or virtual training as needed.

In a medical emergency call 999 and follow the instructions given by the ambulance service call handler. Please note you can also call Immedicare for additional support and advice ahead of the paramedics arriving. Under these circumstances as part of the Immedicare response they will also liaise with the attending crew and help with handover of clinical details and patient condition.

Positive Approach to Care™ (PAC™) Training is for staff or family who are supporting people living with dementia

Background

Teepa Snow has developed the Positive Approach to Care™ concept to support people living with dementia by equipping both formal and informal carers with specific skills aimed at increasing understanding of what it is like to live with dementia. Her approach is focused on care delivery, rather than theories.




Positive Approach to Care™ training incorporates:

GEMS™ concept: where people living with dementia are viewed as precious gems (sapphire, diamond, emerald, amber, ruby and pearl) and the focus is on what skills remain, rather than what is lost. It explains the changes in the brain and why people living with dementia may behave in a certain way and supports the care giver to appreciate what it is like to live with dementia, to accept the person with dementia is unable to change but that the caregiver can be flexible in their approach to make care giving easier by matching the approach with the specific needs of the individual.



GEMS™





Positive Approach to Care™ training incorporates:

- Positive Physical Approach™ (PPA™), which is about how we approach those with dementia at different GEM levels
- It also includes Hand under Hand™ (HuH™), concept which is a practical and physical method of working with the person living with dementia to connect and deliver care on a variety of levels. This can include: Eating, Bathing, Grooming etc



The Training

The training is delivered by Gemma Atkinson who is the Specialist Community Occupational Therapist within Ryedale, Whitby and Scarborough Mental Health Services for Older People; she is also a certified PAC™ trainer.

Training sessions generally take place at Cross Lane Hospital in Scarborough 6 times a year and the training session lasts all day.



The training is free.

The next session for this year is the 12th October.



Hub Clubs



Hub Clubs are the Dementia Forward way of delivering day services. They are centered around the person diagnosed with meaningful, tailored activity but also give the family carer a full day of respite.

We run them in 8 locations across North Yorkshire and York.

Wellbeing cafes also run in 14 locations every week. The cafes provide an afternoon of activity and socialising for both the person diagnosed and their carer. There is information and advice on hand and peer support is encouraged.

Young Onset dementia services



We run a dedicated Support and advice service.

We also run outward bound day services every week.

We are trialling place based day services for people who are a higher risk or more impaired.


North Yorkshire Dementia Services
