Abnormal blood test(s) suggestive of haematological cancer For Acute Leukaemia make immediate referral by contacting the Haematologist on-call	
Chronic Myeloid Leukaemia	
Chronic Lymphocytic Leukaemia with Hb<10g/L, or Low platelets <100 \times 10 9 /L or with the following symptoms night sweats, tiredness and unexplained weight loss	
Myeloma	
With significant paraproteinaemia (IgG>20gLl, 1gA>10g/L) or presence of Bence-Jones Proteinuria – not Polyclonal Light chains or Immunoglobulins	
With any paraproteinaemia with symptoms of back pain or bone pain, anaemia (Hb <10g/L), acute or deteriorating renal impairment	
Suggested by imaging and confirmed by paraprotein aemia or Bence Jones Proteinuria	
Lymphoma For enlarged lymph nodes with no other features, use the Suspected Malignant Lymph Nodes referral form	
Lymphadenopathy with abnormal FBC	
Splenomegaly and night sweats and unexplained weight loss
