Fire Door Safety Week

September 23 - 29 marked #FireDoorSafetyWeek, an awareness week launched in 2013 in response to a legacy of fire door neglect. The campaign aims raise awareness of the role that fire doors play in protecting life and property.

Often fire doors are neglected and not maintained properly, which can have devastating effects. Issues around the installation of fire doors are often seen by the fire service, and building owners are encouraged to check the operation and condition of their fire doors and report those that aren't satisfactory.

Trusted Transfer Pathway-Feedback

Homes across the Vale of York are thanked for their work to implement the Trusted Transfer Pathway. It was noted that the IPC policy that accompanies the pathway has been updated.

We are encouraging homes to use the feedback form as necessary to report on positive and negative experience of use. Resources and more information on how to ensure you are doing everything possible to maintain fire doors and more can be found on the <u>Fire Door Safety</u> <u>Week website</u>.
