September Partners in Care- Thank You



The group took part in detailed discussion around experiences of discharge, CHC funding processes, and how the supply of continence product service could be improved. Data Security Protection Toolkit

Peter Adeyemo from NHS England and Improvement attended the meeting, to advise on how both care homes and domiciliary providers can complete DSPT and what benefits this can provide. It was emphasised the importance of effective communication to support effective care provision and the need to comply with data protection legislation. By completing the entry level self-assessment (14 questions) access to NHS Mail can be achieved, which can provide a more secure method of digitally sharing information. Flu Preparations

Peter Hudson from Public Health England and Phillippa Press from City of York Council gave an update to the group on how to access vaccinations for both residents and staff. They also gave tips on how to ensure you are prepared for flu season, including:

- Designating a named member of staff as a flu champion
- Keeping a log of residents who have consented to or declined vaccination
- Keeping a log of staff who have been vaccinated.
- Displaying flu information in communal staff areas.

StatLock Catheter Usage

Hayley Clayton from the continence team at York Teaching Hospital NHS Foundation Trust attended the meeting, and updated that use StatLock catheters in the hospital have resumed. These need to be changed weekly, and can be prescribed in packs of 5.

It is planned for training in catheter use to be delivered for all care homes and domiciliary providers, but in the meantime please find a guide to their use through this <u>link</u>.
