
Dementia Friends

Care Home Capacity Tracker Update

A big thank you our care homes in the North Yorkshire County Council area. 100% of our in scope homes in the area are now registered and updating bed availability through the care home



Study into the Physical Health Care Needs of Older Care Home Residents capacity tacker. 95% of in scope homes across the Vale of York as a whole are registered, meaning great progress has been made to reducing unneeded ring round calls. Our partners in local authority and continuing healthcare continue to use the tracker to access bed availability for homes who update the tracker.

However further work is still required, and all homes using are reminded to update their bed figures on the tracker at least weekly (even if that is just logging and pressing "save capacities" if figures have not changed).

Should discharge or brokerage teams contact your home when the tracker has been updated, please remind them to use it before calling.

The Personal Social Services Unit (PSSRU) at the University of Manchester is undertaking a study on how best to meet the physical health care needs of older care home residents. This work is funded by the National Institute for Health Research School for Social Care Research and is looking at the external support that care homes receive and the difference that this makes to care home residents in terms of reducing unnecessary hospital admissions and ensuring that residents are well cared for to the end of their lives. It is not about the nature or quality of care that care homes themselves provide, but rather about the NHS input they receive from GPs, district nurses, geriatricians, palliative care staff, specialist care home support teams etc.

As part of this research they have developed a questionnaire in collaboration with Healthwatch North Tyneside that seeks to identify which of a list of ten important characteristics of care home support services interested members of the public think are most important. They are hoping to engage at least 100 people in this element of the study, and it is vital that they represent the opinions of lay people with relevant knowledge to represent residents' and families' views
