Recognition of Flu Vaccination Uptake Amongst Care Home Staff in the North of England

Please find a letter from NHS England providing details of a scheme that recognises the efforts made by Care Homes (residential & nursing), Hospices and Domiciliary

Care providers who have achieved a high level of flu vaccine uptake amongst their health and social care staff who are directly involved in the care of vulnerable people.

The organisations that have achieved a certain level of vaccination for their staff will receive a Bronze, Silver or Gold certificate depending upon the percentage of staff that have been vaccinated.

70% of staff or over vaccinated will receive a Gold Accreditation 60-69% of staff vaccinated will receive a Silver Accreditation 50-59% of staff vaccinated will receive a Bronze Accreditation.

City of York Council: Adults Services Training in February

City of York Council's Workforce Development Unit offer a large number of training sessions relevant to the adult social care. Please find the full list of training planned for the January-March period, and a further inform on the training taking place in February below.

Mental Health - Bitesize 7 February 2019 in West Offices York. 9.30-11.00 Part of the Adult Bitesize Programme – this is a 1.5 hour course which offers an overview of Mental Health.

Topics covered include: Recognising and responding appropriately to signs of mental ill health and understanding the concept of mental health and the myths that can contribute towards stigma

This course is aimed primarily at those working with adults.

Virtual Dementia Tour (3 sessions available)

14 February 2019 in the Priory Street Centre, York

This inspirational training will provide delegates with the opportunity to have an experience of what living with Dementia might be like and change their practice to ensure service users are receiving the best possible care for them. Scary, Intimidating, Confusing and a feeling of vulnerability, the <u>Virtual Dementia Tour</u> is a 'must have' training for every care professional or family member that wants to understand dementia by walking in the shoes of a person with the disease.Please note - this is a challenging course , you will experience the vulnerability of living with Dementia the moment you enter the classroom. This course is aimed at those working with adults.

Fees: This course is free to CYC staff; York Adults care services: £20

Train the Trainer – Introduction to the Mental Capacity Act 20 February 2019 9.30-4.30 in West Offices, York.

This 1-day course will enable you to teach 'Introduction to the Mental Capacity Act' within your own organisation. Care Home Capacity Tracker Update

A fantastic 83% of Vale of York residential and nursing homes are now registered and updating the Care Home Capacity Tracker, and North Yorkshire County Council are now relying on the tracker rather than ring rounds for all homes in their area which have updated in the last 7 days

However further work is still required, and all homes using are reminded to update their bed figures on the tracker at least weekly (even if that is just logging and pressing "save capacities" if figures have not changed).

Should discharge or brokerage teams contact your home when the tracker has been updated, please remind them to use it before calling.
