Medications on Admission Reminder

A reminder to our partner care homes, that residents medication (especially those in blister packs) should not be sent in on admission. Instead a copy of the residents MAR chart and any other relevant information about medication, AND any medication such as insulin, creams, inhalers. Should be sent.



Portable fans in health and social care facilities: risk of cross infection

Please note the attached alert from NHS Improvement regarding the use of portable fans in health and social care facilities, and take action as appropriate. The use of these fans in clinical areas has been linked to cross infection, and is not recommended for use during outbreaks of infection or with a resident known or suspected to be infectious.

The deadline for actions to be underway is 5 February, and 2 April for them to be complete.

Flu Vaccination Update: City of York Council and North Yorkshire Council

North Yorkshire County Council

Local authority employed Health and Social care staff in North Yorkshire can now download a voucher from the intranet, and ask their manager to sign it. The signed voucher needs to be presented before the vaccine is administered. Most community pharmacies and many GP practices are providing flu vaccinations and NYYCC recommend that staff contact their community pharmacy or GP practice to check they are providing the service before attending and for GP practices, this needs to be the member of staff's registered practice. our PGD. NYCC is then reimbursed per vaccine.

Independently employed health and social care staff from North Yorkshire care homes and domically providers are now also eligible for the scheme. Please contact: carly.walker@northyorks.gov.uk for a voucher

City of York Council

Please find attached a letter that has been sent to all care providers currently contracted by City of York Council. NHS England has awarded the council £20,000 for immunisation of care staff, which can be claimed be providers either through filling out the attached form (to reimburse costs for providers who have already vaccinated staff) or through claiming flu vouchers (for yet to be vaccinated) which can be redeemed at most high street pharmacies, with the exception of Boots.

This funding is available for care staff and volunteers, though not residents and as the budget is finite it cannot be guaranteed you will receive 100% of the requested sum. To apply please return the reimbursement forms and submit requests for vouchers to Philippa by 31 January 2019.
