We are working with partners to create an end of life care strategy that strengthens our commitment to improve and develop end of life care and support services.

Care home bed state tool update

Please note we are updating advice for homes where bed capacity has not changed. If homes where this is the case could log in once a week and press save

on "save these spare capacities button", this will show that capacity has been updated even though the figures have remained the same. This will give assurance to care partners that your figures are up to date, and will remove the need for calls to check.

A reminder North Yorkshire County Council are now halting ring round calls for all homes in their area that have updated figures in the last 7 days. The Care Home Bed State Tool will become the primary mechanism for them to establish available bed numbers. However homes with figures that have not been updated within 7 days will stick receive calls, so all users are encouraged to log in and update figures once a week even if bed numbers have not changed.
