New policy attaching photos to referrals

With the support of YTHFT, VOY and SRY CCGs have developed a Dermatology Photography Commissioning Statement. This establishes a CCG policy in which the CCGs requests that primary care referrers submit three photographs including a dermatoscopic image to help enable clinical triage of referrals.

POLCV page - updated commissioning statements

Bariatric Surgery - Prior to the new local Tier 3 Obesity Management Service pilot that started at the beginning of this year all requests for bariatric surgery were considered by the Individual Funding Request (IFR) Panel. The CCG has updated its bariatric surgery commissioning statement to reflect the new pathway and availability of the Tier 3 programme. The commissioning statement will be applied by the multi-disciplinary team panel at the Tier 3 service following completion of the programme when considering onward referral to Tier 4. GPs should continue to refer all potential candidates for Tier 4 services via Tier 3 in the first instance, unless there are exceptional circumstances which warrant a referral to the IFR Panel.
