Cervical Screening Assessor Training for Humber, Coast and Vale

A course has been commissioned by Haxby Group Training at the University of Hull to provide training for 80 students delivered in two cohorts, 27 & 28 February (27 & 28) and September (dates TBC) – further details will be confirmed in due course. In order for the courses to run we need to ensure there are adequate numbers of assessors available to assess the students in practice.

A register of cervical screening assessors is being devised to match support students.

Are you or one of the nurses in your practice interested in becoming a smear assessor?

Current NHS Cervical Screening Guidance (November 2016) states: Assessors must be a registered nurse, doctor or physician associate. Assessors should have effective teaching and communication skills and ideally hold a relevant mentoring and/or teaching gualification. They must:

- be practising sample takers with a green RAG rating
- have had 12 months continuous experience following completion of initial training
- have undertaken a minimum of 50 samples following completion of initial training

Funding has been secured to support backfill costs to practices for the release of nurses to fulfil the assessor role. The commitment would be 17.5 hours per student consisting of 7.5 hours for an initial training visit, 7.5 hours for a final assessment visit and 2.5 hour admin. Haxby Training will provide an initial training session for assessors and support assessors with queries.

Nurses keen to be a cervical screening assessor need to complete the attached application form, return it to training@haxbygroup.co.uk and confirm your attendance at the initial assessor training. If you are unable to make the session on the 30 January please let Haxby Training know, and another session may be arranged in response to need.

Details on how to apply for the course will follow once finalised with the University of Hull.

Many thanks in advance for your support and commitment. If the assessor role is shared across practices then we should be able to achieve the volume of training required across the region to support us all.

Diabetes Foot Screening Education (CPD)

As part of the Podiatry contract with the Vale of York CCG the Podiatry team provide on-going training for health care workers in the detection and management of diabetic foot disease. The session will outline the skills needed to correctly screen patients with diabetes for foot problems at their annual diabetes review and provide details of where and how to refer on those deemed at increased or high risk of developing foot disease, in line with current NICE guidelines. There will be both a demonstration and an opportunity to practice neurological and vascular assessment of the foot.

The sessions are free of charge and a certificate of competency will be issued to evidence CPD.
