Flu Prevention Resources and Awards

Please find attached a set of resources from Public Health England's Health Protection Team for your information. This was circulated earlier in the year and at the September Partners in Care, and is an aid to help your organisation prevent, detect and manage outbreaks of flu. The pack contains:

- A PHE poster describing how to detect influenza outbreaks in care homes, and the steps to take to minimise transmission within the care home
- A visitors' poster from NHS England/PHE
- A data collection form which should be used to record information about those affected during an influenza outbreak
- An information sheet on how to collect nasal swabs from residents with symptoms of influenza

Also a reminder that NHS England and Improvement are re-running their awards scheme to recognise care providers with high uptake of vaccination amongst staff.
