Recognising and Responding to Deterioration Conference- Slides

Thank you all those who attend the conference around recognising and responding to deterioration on 26 November in York. The day focused on the trial of the STOP and WATCH tool to help identify deterioration in residents through softer signs, and included input from care homes, domiciliary providers, GP's, the care home and dementia team at Tees, Esk and Wear Valleys NHS Foundation Trust. There was also discussion around topics including falls prevention, sepsis, dementia and oral health.

Fast Track Improvement Team

Lynda Ruddock from the Vale of York Fast Track Improvement Team attended the November Partners in Care to update on the work she and colleague Chris Charters have been conducting to review and improve the delivery of fast track care, for which funding is available to individuals in 'rapidly deteriorating condition that may be entering a terminal phase. This project has been a collaboration between the CCG at St Leonard's Hospice working to assist, maintain and develop understanding of the eligibility criteria for funding. As discussed at Partners in Care, the three component forms required for funding are consent, the fast track tool and the care plan. These are attached for your information, alongside a summary of the teams work and a newly produced patient information document.

Alert: Risk of death and severe harm from ingesting superabsorbent polymer gel granules

NHS England and Improvement have released a National Patient Safety Alert, relating to the use of Superabsorbent polymer gel granules (including sachets, mats and loose powder) which used to reduce spillage onto bedding, clothing and floors when patients use urine bottles or vomit bowls, or when staff move fluid-filled containers (eg washbowls, bedpans). As a result of 12 reports of ingestion by patients which includes 2 deaths, a new guidance reinforces that polymer gels are only required for exceptional infection control purposes. This alert requires any organisation still using these products to protect patients by introducing strict restrictions on their use.

Dementia Case Finding in the Vale of York (sent on behalf of Rachel Instone, Tees, Esk and Wear Valleys NHS Foundation Trust)

My name is Rachel Instone and I am an Assistant Psychologist with Tees Esk and Wear Valley NHS Trust. The Care Home and Dementia Team and the Memory Clinic, commissioned by the NHS Vale of York CCG, is running a service looking for individuals living in care homes who may have undiagnosed dementia. The reason for doing this work is to ensure that we provide the best possible, well informed care for our elderly population. In collaboration with GPs and care homes, I will be collecting data on residents who have an official diagnosis of dementia and also working with care home staff to identify any residents who they feel may have an undiagnosed dementia.

In York City, the Integrated Care Team are also working on a similar project, these <u>slides</u> will tell you who is covering which home. I have started this work in Selby and would like to thank all the care homes and GPs who have helped with this project so far. React to Falls Prevention

The group were updated on the progress of the CCG's React to Falls Prevention Training for care homes. The training has so far been undertaken by 31 Vale of York homes, and 450 staff.

The aims of the training are to:

- Review falls policies/risk assessment tools/care plans/falls evaluation methods
- Implement 'Days between falls boards'
- Use the falls prevention
 prompt to assist in
 recognition of falls risks
- Encourage all staff to be involved with falls prevention and management
- Ensure that all staff attend React to Falls Prevention Training
