NICE National Institute for Health and Care Excellenc

Helping to Prevent Winter Deaths and Illnesses Associated with Cold Homes

NICE have a produced the quick guide <u>'Helping to prevent winter deaths and</u> <u>illnesses associated with cold homes'</u> which is based on their <u>'Excess winter deaths and illness and the health</u> <u>risks associated with cold homes' guideline</u>.

Aimed at home care managers it raises awareness about how simple, well planned, preventative action could help vulnerable people currently living in cold homes avoid serious illness or death.

Home care managers can also support staff to complete the '<u>Helping people</u> <u>living in cold homes e-learning module</u>', developed by Public Health England based on NICE guidelines

The Inter-Health and Social Care Infection Control Transfer Form

The Inter-health and Social Care Infection Control Transfer from has been developed to help healthcare organisations share information in the transfer of patients/residents to and from health and social care facilities.

This supports The Health and Social Care Act 2008: Code of Practice on the prevention and control of infection and related guidance (Department of Health 2015), which states that "suitable accurate information on infections be provided to any person concerned with providing further support or nursing/medical care in a timely fashion".

The Inter-health and Social Care form should accompany the patient/ resident and, where possible, a copy filed in their notes. The information provided is vital in facilitating the receiving health and social care facility to implement the necessary infection control measures, and help to reduce the risk of spreading infectious organisms.
