Need to know

NIHR Clinical Research Network Yorkshire and Humber

New Research Opportunity – Online Weight Loss programme (OWL)

The aim of the study is to determine the effectiveness of an online programme for weight loss compared with no intervention. The CRN Yorkshire and Humber would like to invite Expressions of Interest from General Practices to participate in the OWL research project.

Start Date: September 2019 closing date February 2020

- Practice Involvement: By clinicians/practice: GP As this search is quite broad GP's do not have to screen their lists of eligible patients from the search. However, we are happy for them to add additional exclusions to their main search i.e. if they code for a patient in a care home or palliative care.
- Admin Preparation and perform a database search (BMI ≥30 kg/m2 in the past 12 months, aged ≥ 18 years), and mail-out using Docmail. Timeframe for the mail-out to be discussed with the study team.
- Patient Involvement: The letter from their GP will invite the patient to consider taking part in the study and the patient will be directed to the study website for more information or to contact the study the research team for questions.
 Patients who give their consent will be randomly allocated to the control group or one of three online weight management programmes for a duration of 8 weeks. A shopping voucher will be given to participants who complete the 8 week follow up questionnaires.
- Practice Payment: Research costs of £114.40 paid by the study team for study set-up and mail out Service Support Costs paid by the CRN on a quarterly basis following completion of the database search and mail out £43.92.
