#### Share Your Views- End of Life Care Quality Standard

Care providers are being invited to have their say on work NICE is undertaking to update <u>their end of life\_care quality standard</u>. It covers end of life care services for adults (aged 18 or over) with progressive life-limiting conditions in the final weeks and months of life. They are currently consulting with stakeholders to help identify what they think are the key areas for quality improvement for this topic. #### **Connecting Care Homes Programme- Opportunity Still Available**

The CCG would still be interested in hearing from any providers not already registered in the connecting care homes programme would be like to take part. The programme is open to nursing and residential care homes, and would trial use of a laptop to be kept within the home with the purpose of supporting effective communication for visiting clinicians. The laptop would enable direct access to the clinicians health systems therefore allowing safer and more effective care. Homes do not need to have undertaken the DSPT to take part in this programme, however homes that have completed the standards met level would also be able to use NHS Mail on the laptop.
