PPE Guidance-Updated

The national advice around use of PPE in health and social care workers in the context of COVID-19 has been updated. Please read this amended guidance through this <u>link</u>.

Please find a briefing attached from the Department of Health and Social Care, which details when and how to get in touch with the National Supply Disruption Response (NSDR), as well as how they are working to improve speed and delivery of these items and to help suppliers restock by establishing a Parallel Supply Chain (PSC) dedicated to PPE. Once established this will take pressure off the supply chain for "business as usual" items.

Need to know

Coronavirus (COVID-19) Related Deaths in the Community Guidance for Medics, Care Homes and Hospices

Please find through this <u>link</u> a document which amalgamates guidance from the Coroner's Office, City of York Council and North Yorkshire County Council (Among other organisations) with regard to COVID-19 related deaths. This includes guidance around handling for care settings, and an update on changes to the Medical Certificate of Cause of Death (MCCD). We will look to advise further on this guidance at upcoming Project ECHO Networks.

Dementia and COVID-19

Dementia UK have published <u>guidance</u> for families on looking after a relative with dementia during the outbreak, which may also be helpful to social care providers. This British Geriatric Society have also published <u>guidance</u> around managing confirmed or suspected delirium in the context of COVID-19.





Partners in Care- COVID-19 Response ECHO Network

All Vale of York care homes and domiciliary providers are invited to join our Partners in Care COVID-19 support program. Through Project ECHO we are able to offer video conferencing information, to provide the latest best practice guidance, training, and peer support to care providers in our region at this difficult time. Project ECHO uses the Zoom online platform which requires internet access via lap top, tablet or smart phone.

These sessions will take place every **Monday** and **Thursday** from **14:00** and will last up to an hour. The first two sessions have covered the latest guidance around PPE, how to best use NHS Mail and the Care Home Capacity Tracker and how to support staff at this difficult time. The sessions will continue to update on the latest guidance, and provide an opportunity for questions and Q&A. Topics that have been requested to cover at future sessions include that the group have requested to update on at future sessions include around advance care planning, managing residents with dementia, palliative care and changes to verification of death.

Registration with NHS Mail

During the current Covid-19 pandemic, secure communication between health and social care services is more important than ever. To support this, NHS England and Improvement are now able to fast track roll out of NHSmail to the care sector, without the need to complete the Data Security and Protection Toolkit at this time. We are asking all care providers to take up this offer. NHSmail offers a recognised secure email system, which will allow patient identifiable data to be shared with healthcare services. There is also opportunity for all NHSmail account holders to have access to Microsoft Teams, which offers a video conferencing facility to enable video consultations during periods of social distancing.
