List of procedures classified as Aerosol Generating Procedures (AGP; Public Health England 2014)

- Intubation, extubation and related procedures, for example manual ventilation and open suctioning
- Cardiopulmonary resuscitation
- Bronchoscopy (unless carried out through a closed circuit ventilation system)
- Surgery and post-mortem procedures in which high-speed devices are used
- Dental procedures
- Non-invasive ventilation (NIV), eg Bilevel Positive Airway Pressure ventilation (BiPAP)
- Continuous Positive Airway Pressure ventilation (CPAP)
- High-frequency oscillating ventilation (HFOV)
- Induction of sputum

The following procedure is considered locally to be an AGP:

Chest physiotherapy

The following procedures are not classified as AGP:

- Mechanical ventilation or respiratory therapy treatment when AGP is performed via a closed system
- Closed suctioning with invasive ventilation
- Nasopharyngeal aspiration
- Nebulisation
- Taking a throat swab
- Patients coughing
