PPE Guidance

IPC have circulated a <u>flyer</u> to providers detailing correct usage of face masks in care home settings. They have also produced a <u>video</u> to assist with donning and doffing procedures.

IPC have also produced guidance on admission and care of patients during COVID-19, setting and context. <u>Admission and Care of</u> <u>Patients</u>, designed to help staff when receiving your residents back from hospital or admitted from home and/or another care setting.
