### **Infection Prevention Control Training Offer**

As part of current national offer of extended support to care homes including infection prevention training, care homes will have received an offer from the CCG to support you with this. Training includes hand washing technique and the use of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), and has been offered and delivered face to face to providers.

We are aware that having staff visit your home to deliver this training can be difficult for many reasons currently and so we would like to offer the opportunity to receive this training virtually via Project ECHO. Much like the face to face training that has been offered, we can offer 2 hour sessions through which we can train key members of your staff. It is anticipated that through the 'train the trainer' approach this learning can then be cascaded across your staff by those who attend the initial session.

This training will be made available more widely for supported living and domiciliary providers who express an interest going forward.


### Briefing - Positive people discharged from hospital/ retesting

Please find the attached a briefing on COVID retesting and people being discharged from hospital that has been authored by Dr Andrew Lee (Executive Director of Primary Care and Population Health) alongside clinicians at Public Health England and City of York Council. This covers what the test is, as well as interpreting the results both early into an infection and later into the infection. The document references care homes, however the information is relevant to all social care providers.

#### **Care Home and Dementia Team Update**

This week, we wanted to share a <u>leaflet</u> that Tees, Esk and Wear Valleys NHS Foundation Trust have created for coping with the death of someone that you know. The leaflet covers common symptoms that you might experience and some tips of how to deal with them.



We also wanted to share again the <u>leaflet</u> from Namaste Care that gives advice on how to help residents have a sensory-rich end of life with ideas about soothing touch, sound, smell, taste and vision.

### NHS Mail Supported and Feedback Sessions for Care Providers

A fantastic 97 care homes and domiciliary providers from the Vale of York now have NHS Mail registered in their setting to allow secure and efficient communication with health and social care services. For providers who would like support in getting started using their account and in using Microsoft Teams, NHS England and Improvement are hosting bi-weekly webinars taking place every **Tuesday and Thursday 2:00-3:00**. # Tiger Eye Protector Product – Removal from the Supply Chain in respect of Covid-19 Use

The Department for Health and Social Care have released a CAS alert for certain models of protective goggles and frames, which have been tested and do not meet the current requirements for splash protection and shouldn't be used in a Covid-19 setting. The details of the products concerned are below:

Tiger Medical Products: Protective Goggles and Frames Product Codes PG0001 – F and PG0001-L Barcode for Frames: 6948548400132; Barcode for Lenses: 6948548400224 NPC for Frames (BTP083 and BTP403) and Lenses (BTP097, BTP404 and BTP439)

#### **PRINCIPLE Study**

Individuals who have been diagnosed with or who are showing symptoms of COVID-19 and are aged 65 or over (or 50-64 with certain conditions) are able to self-enrol into the PRINCIPLE study.
