# Use of Tablets and Digital Devices by Independent Care Providers

Independent care providers across the Vale of York are using digital technology to a greater extent recently (including tablets allocated to a number of services by the CCG) to enable virtual consultations, additional clinical use and by residents. This is a reminder to follow best IPC practice when using these devices in care settings. Please ensure regular cleaning and between use. It is good practice to limit use of an individual device to individual units where possible. For those providers who have been allocated multiple tablets by the CCG, the number allocated was partially based on the number of floors to help support limiting risk of cross infection.

#### **Trusted Transfer Documentation for Care Homes**

Following recent discussions around discharge related issues (including at a recent Partners in Care/ECHO Network where representative from the discharge team responded to feedback from care home managers), a reminder for care homes to use the Trusted Transfer of Care Document where appropriate to accompany residents on admission to hospital either electronically or through paper copy.

Please note the completion of the Trusted Transfer of Care Document is the responsibility of the care home with the exception of any changes during the hospital stay which must be documented on the variance sheet (by hospital staff). Any patients who are a new admission to your care home will not be transferred with the Trusted Transfer of Care Document but we still expect that full information and supporting documents and medications are provided by the discharging hospital unit.

For any issues experienced such as missing documents or medication on discharge please let us know as soon as possible so we can follow this up with YTHFT partners.

#### CAS Alert: Personal Protective Equipment and Heat- Risk of Heat Stress

Wearing Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) in warm/hot environments increases the risk of heat stress. Heat stress occurs when the body is unable to cool itself enough to maintain a healthy temperature. Heat stress can cause heat exhaustion and lead to heat stroke if the person is unable to cool down.

Measures to control the temperature of clinical environments and enable staff to make behavioural adaptations to stay cool and well hydrated should be made. Staff may require more frequent breaks and the frequency of PPE changes may increase, with а resulting increase in demand.

#### Withdrawal of Weian Type IIR Surgical Masks and Gloves

We have been made aware that a Type IIR facemask produced by Weian may contain latex and could cause anaphylactic shock in anyone who is allergic to latex. The recommendation is to avoid wearing these masks and use an alternative brand.

The following gloves (blue sail+ Disposable Nitrile Examination Gloves) are not fit for use because they do not meet EN455 rating. The specification for the INTCO Medical Nitrile Examination Gloves cannot be validated and they should also not be used. For more information please follow this <u>link</u>.

#### Free Psychological First Aid in Emergencies Training

Public Health England have created a free psychological first aid in emergencies training for frontline staff and volunteers. Training will equip staff to provide support and recognise people at risk of distress The course follows a globally recommended model for supporting people during emergencies, tailored to the
