Webinar for annual health checks for people with learning disabilities and / or autism

Tuesday 21 July 15:00-16:00 (via Zoom)

Skills for Care and Learning Disability England will be hosting a webinar looking at the challenges and opportunities around annual health checks for people with learning disabilities and / or autism. This webinar will focus on how support services can help people with learning disabilities and / or autism stay healthy and will include some examples of how they can help people even with the current COVID-19 restrictions.

We will be looking at a number of resources that can support people, their families and paid supporters to understand and know how to access annual health checks more easily. The webinar will be led by Skills for Care and Learning Disability England. It is building on their work with NDTi and VODG on a project to <u>improve</u> access to Annual Health Checks.

Use of Tablets and Digital Devices by Independent Care Providers

Independent care providers across the Vale of York are using digital technology to a greater extent recently (including tablets allocated to a number of services by the CCG) to enable virtual consultations, additional clinical use and by residents. This is a reminder to follow best IPC practice when using these devices in care settings. Please ensure regular cleaning and between use. It is good practice to limit use of an individual device to individual units where possible. For those providers who have been allocated multiple tablets by the CCG, the number allocated was partially based on the number of floors to help support limiting risk of cross infection.

Type IIR Cardinal Masks Advisory Note

Please note the recommendation from MHRA through this <u>link</u> that all lots of the product detailed below are disposed of locally.

- Mask, Type IIR
- Supplier: Cardinal Health
- NPC: BWM028
- MPC: AT74535UK
- Applies to all lots of AT74535UK (Lot numbers detailed in the link above)

There is a risk to staff wearing the mask if the foam strip on the mask flakes and enters their airway or mouth. There have also been complaints of the ties and/or stitching coming away from the mask

Withdrawal of Weian Type IIR Surgical Masks and Gloves

We have been made aware that a Type IIR facemask produced by Weian may contain latex and could cause anaphylactic shock in anyone who is allergic to latex. The recommendation is to avoid wearing these masks and use an alternative brand.

The following gloves (blue sail+ Disposable Nitrile Examination Gloves) are not fit for use because they do not meet EN455 rating. The specification for the INTCO Medical Nitrile Examination Gloves cannot be validated and they should also not be used. For more information please follow this <u>link</u>.
