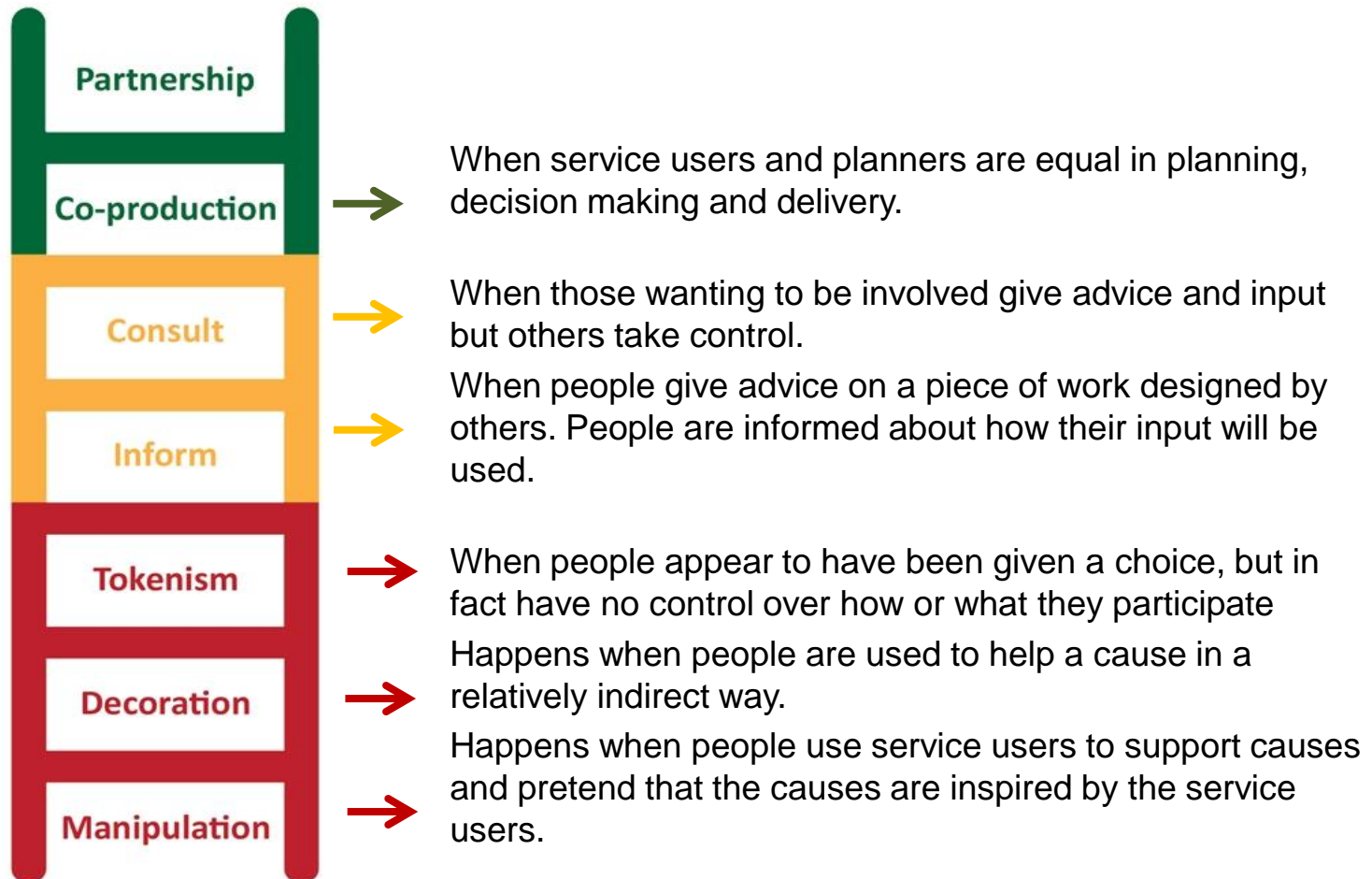
“They can have their own say in what happens and if they don’t like it they can change it”

What is co-production? Does this definition reflect what you said?

- 'In practice, co-production involves people who use services being consulted, included and working together from the start to the end of any project that affects them. When co-production works best, people who use services and carers are valued by organisations as equal partners, can share power and have influence over decisions made'.
- 'Real co-production means that people are truly involved in planning and designing services from the very beginning'

Hart's ladder of participation



As SEND services, we need to ensure that we are co-producing with parents, carers, children and young people. Those that we work with need to know that their involvement is valued and will be as equal as those who work at CYC and CCG. Knowing the distinction between each level will help you to know what is needed to coproduce and partner with users of services.

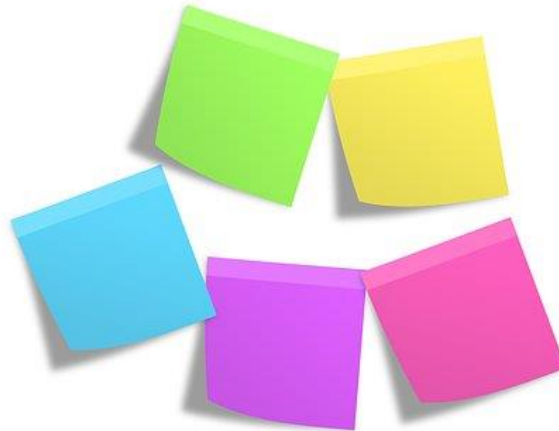

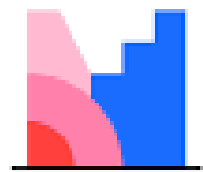
