CHC Assessment Resumption Update

Anita Griffiths updated on the resumption of CHC assessments at last week's Partners in Care Virtual Forum. For an audio version of this update please get in touch.

NHS England has stated from 1 September all CHC teams nationally should resume their assessment work.

• DST's: People have being placed on the waiting list for DST's since

19th March 2020, are now been brought forward for their DST's. In order to give a robust assessment, the CHC assessor and the SCA

will

need access to their care plans and daily records, and a member of staff who is familiar with their daily care needs. We are inviting family to join the meeting virtually, and in some cases the social care assessor may also do this.

- Checklists': CHC assessors will resume completing Checklists, not nursing home managers' at this time
- Change in condition: resume completing and sending these to CHC
- FNC referrals: submit as usual, CHC will complete a health needs assessment and a checklist if appropriate
- Reviews: will continue, with virtual families, but will need to access care

Homes for these from now

CHC Staff will have masks and gloves for direct access visits.

Updated Adults Social Care Guidance and Hospital Discharge Guidance

- A single page has been published usefully bringing together all ASC guidance for home care, supported living and care homes in one place. This page can be visited through this link.
- New hospital discharge guidance has been published, which replaces the guidance first published in March
- This builds on the same day discharge to assess model, continuing with the requirement for care providers to start care provision the same day as referral, 7 days a week. Full details for care providers can be found through section 9 of the guidance, available through this link.

Data Security and Protection Toolkit- For Action

Individual care homes/domiciliary providers to who have not yet registered or previously completed the DSPT, are being asked to register an account for the by 30 September. By registering for this, you will be able to access a training programme which is currently being designed at a national and regional level to help guide you through completion from October-March. The deadline for submissions is now 31 March 2021
