Direct Referrals for Dietetics, Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy (Care Homes Only)

Following a suggestion at the Partners in Care Virtual Forum, the guidance for homes on making a direct referral in the above specialities has been amended to ask that homes also send a copy of the referral to their GP practice for information. This way the information is shared with practice directly after the referral has been made.

This has been added to the <u>webpage</u> where the forms and guidance are available.

Visiting, MCA and Care Setting Guidance Updates

- <u>Visiting Guidance</u>. The CYC/NYCC visiting guidance has been amended to include the continuation of window visits when other visiting restrictions are in place. Visits for people who are receiving End of Life Care should be viewed as essential visits, in line with the Five Priorities for Care.
- MCA Guidance: This has been updated to clarify where face to face professional visits are appropriate in the context of the DoLS legal framework.
- <u>Care Home</u> and <u>Domiciliary Care Guidance</u>. These have been updated to include a new section on supporting Test and Trace through sharing contact details of staff, visitors/ family members and previous residents when requested

NHS Mail Deactivation and Format Changes

The CCG has been notified that any care provider NHS Mail accounts that haven't been active within the last 6 months will be **deactivated on 31 October**. We are currently contacting any providers that we have been notified have an inactive account, however to prevent this deactivation then all you need to do is to log into your account.

We have also been made aware that from 25 September the format of care provider generic email address will change from

care.location.careproviderODscode@nhs.net to care.ODScode@nhs.net. We are awaiting more guidance around this and will be communicate accordingly, but we have been reassured that following the change any emails sent to the previous email address will automatically be directed through to the new address.

Safeguarding Adults in Care Homes: NICE Guideline Consultation

NICE are seeking feedback on their draft guidance about safeguarding adults in care homes. Your comments will help ensure the advice right for care home staff and people living in care homes.

The guidance aims to:

- improve staff awareness of safeguarding
- ensure staff are confident and able to report concerns appropriately when needed
- inform other health and care practitioners and commissioners and people affected by the issues about safeguarding.

The draft guidance includes a set of indicators to help practitioners

Press Release: Vale of York CCG's Quality and Nursing Team up for another Nursing Times Award

NHS Vale of York Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) could win a Nursing Times award later this year thanks to their work with care homes and domiciliary providers, which has helped reduce avoidable harm and improved the deterioration of residents within our community.

A partnership was formed with the CCG and Yorkshire and Humber Patient Safety Collaborative to achieve this work, after a rise in residents being admitted to hospital in an emergency. The aim of this initiative was to reduce these unplanned admissions, and increase the staff confidence in recognising the signs for deterioration.

To achieve the increase in confidence, sessions were held face to face within the care homes prior to COVID. However since social distancing guidelines, a
