I am writing in response to your recent request that we received on 5 August 2020 in which you requested the following information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Information Requested

• Within your organisation or any service you commission, is there any use of the following: remote healthcare monitoring for COPD patients or patients with Heart Failure

(Definition for clarity: a patient has either an app, a website link and / or vital sign monitoring where they do this in one place and a clinician reviews their data in another)

- Should there be use of the above listed programs, when these contracts due for review/renewal and where possible please supply the provider company name.
- In addition can you please tell me in which area of your organisation any similar programs are being used (for example for COVID-19 discharge patients, for patients with diabetes)

In relation to diabetes monitoring, we do not directly commission any monitoring within any of our services.
