Your Request for Information

I am writing in response to your recent request that we received on 24 August 2020 in which you requested the following information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Information Requested

Please tell me if from your NHS Local CCG office if you can offer if required by patients via special ordering application through NHS Local CCG, the following preventive and/or therapeutic prescription drugs found useful in medical research papers against Covid:

- 1) Favipiravir (Avigan)
- 2) Ivermectin
- 3) Famotidine (Pepcid Ac)
- 4) Hydroxychloroquin + Azithromycin + Zinc
- 5) Bcg vaccine

Response

I can confirm NHS Vale of York Clinical Commissioning Group holds the information you have requested as per the below.

Although the medicines above may have been shown to be useful in some medical research papers, the full clinical efficacy and safety is still to be established. These would all be considered unlicensed treatments for Covid. Doctors, dentists, independent prescriber nurses and pharmacist prescribers may all prescribe unlicensed treatments, if they:

- are satisfied that there is a sufficient evidence base and/or experience of using the medicine to show its safety and efficacy
- take responsibility for prescribing the medicine and for overseeing the patient's care, including monitoring and follow-up
- record the medicine prescribed and, where common practice is not being followed, the reasons for prescribing this medicine
- are following their professional codes and ethics of their statutory bodies, this

I would not commonly see these being prescribed in primary care for covid, as there is no strong evidence base. However these treatments may be initiated in secondary care under specialist initiation or by the clinical trials team, if they deem it appropriate.
