Engagement report for the Quality and Patient Experience Committee May 2020

Communications and engagement during coronavirus (COVID-19)

During the coronavirus outbreak the communication and engagement team has been focusing on working with the Vale of York population, partners, PCNs and voluntary and community sector. The CCG has been joining in the national conversation on Covid-19 with a mix of local and national messages, as well as health service updates, messages from primary care clinicians and health and wellbeing top tips.

Engagement work:

Survey: How have the coronavirus (COVID-19) restrictions affected your mental health and wellbeing?

- Working with the public health team to rapidly assess the impacts, risks and unintended consequences of the COVID response, to feed into the Vale of York recovery plan. The survey aimed at the public asks how the coronavirus restrictions are affecting mental and physical wellbeing. For example this might be in the way they get medical help or are able to carry out everyday activities for themselves or someone they care for.
- 612 responses in one week online and via phone calls and email.
- Working with the third sector to find out their worries, and gather feedback about what they are hearing from the most vulnerable service users. Interviewed voluntary sector advocates and service users – including The Carers Centre, Mind. Dementia Forward, the deaf community, carers and service users with a disability.

Other engagement:

- Regular catch ups/keeping in touch with Healthwatch York and NY and the carers centre via phone, video and email.
- Regular emails to stakeholder list with key CCG messages messages then cascade through networks. Feature in the Healthwatch quarterly magazine.
- Working with MVP chair to share and develop messages for parents, using the Mumbler platform to reach large audience.
- First online session of the Wheelchair Service User forum on 5 May 2020 to ask for feedback on eligibility criteria updates, personal wheelchair budgets and new communications tools.

Comms and Media

The team has been working closely with local media and have had some good coverage on the BBC radio and Minster FM, York Mix, That's York TV, and in the York Press. Dr Andrew Lee and Dr Nigel Wells have been used as spokespeople for the CCG.

- Working closely with our providers at YTHFT and TEWV
- Liaising with council partners Head of comms dials into calls regularly and liaises with them on proactive comms opportunities
- PCNs / practices: The team has been working with PCNs on regional news stories and comms support. The team sends out the daily COVID-19 update to practices.
- Comms around temporary changes to the treatment and care of hyper acute stroke patients in the Scarborough and Bridlington area. LMC, GB, Primary Care and stakeholder briefing went out w/c 30 April.

They enable the CCG to deliver bespoke content that is relevant to the audience quickly, which is really helpful during the Covid-19 outbreak. Content is shared and cascaded by stakeholders and voluntary sector colleagues.

Work has gone into the launch of the CCG Facebook page and thanks to timely and relevant content the page is growing at a rapid rate. As an example during one week in April The CCG Facebook page reached over 44,000 people, created over 8,000 engagement opportunities (likes, shares, comments) and the videos received over 1,700 views.
