



Deep cleaning guidance in Care Homes

Deep cleaning is a more enhanced programme of environmental cleaning, which compliments the routine daily cleaning in a care home. It includes the thorough cleaning of all surfaces, floors, soft furnishings and reuseable equipment either within the whole environment or in a particular area, e.g. resident's room.

Colour coding

All care home facilities are recommended to adopt the national colour coding scheme for cleaning materials (see below). All disposable and reusable cleaning items, e.g. cloths, mops, buckets, aprons, should be colour coded.

Red	Blue	
Bathrooms, showers, toilets, basins and bathroom floors	General areas, including lounges, offices, corridors and bedrooms

Equipment required for a deep clean

The golden rule for cleaning is to always work from the cleanest area toward the dirtiest area, and from top to bottom, covering all surfaces using a 'S' shaped pattern, taking care not to go over the same area twice. This will greatly reduce the risk of cross contamination. PPE should always be worn, e.g. disposable gloves, apron and eye protection (if there is a risk of splashing to the eyes).

- Clean colour coded buckets, e.g. blue for bedroom, red for en-suite (see colour coding above).
- Disposable colour coded cloths. A new colour coded cloth should be used for each room, be changed as they become soiled and disposed of after use.
- Colour coded floor mop. It is preferable to use disposable mop heads. Reusable mop heads should be laundered on a hot wash after each use.
- Cleaning and disinfectant products, either:
 - A dual purpose cleaning and disinfectant solution at a dilution of 1,000 parts per million available chlorine, e.g. Chlor-Clean, Actichlor Plus

or

Warm water and pH neutral detergent, this should be changed for each episode of cleaning and when moving from one room or environment to another, and when water is visibly dirty or contaminated, followed by a freshly made chlorine-based disinfectant solution, e.g. Milton at 1,000 parts per million (dilution of 1 in 20, e.g. 50 ml of Milton in 1 litre of water) for MRGNB and MRSA or a virucidal product for viral gastroenteritis, sporicidal product for *Clostridioides difficile*

Note: Chlorine-based disinfectants may damage soft furnishings, carpets and furniture. Therefore, detergent and warm water, steam cleaner or carpet shampoo machine, should be used as appropriate.

- Vacuum cleaner fitted with a high particulate filter (HEPA filter).
- Steam cleaner or carpet shampoo machine.

Before cleaning

- Collect all cleaning equipment and appropriate waste bags.
- The person responsible for undertaking the cleaning with detergent and disinfectant should be trained in the process.
- Hands are cleaned before putting on PPE.
- Follow the 'Procedure for a deep clean of a resident's room'.

Upon completion of the deep clean

- Hand are cleaned before removing and disposing of each item of PPE, e.g. pair of gloves, apron, facial protection.
- Ensure all single use PPE is disposed of appropriately and reusable eye and facial protection is cleaned, disinfected and stored appropriately to avoid the risk of contamination.





Example: Procedure for deep cleaning a resident's room

(Deep cleaning should include the following, but is not an exhaustive list)

A risk assessment should be undertaken to identify the order in which the room should be deep cleaned, e.g. working from top to bottom

8.	Picture rails, dado rails	Clean and disinfect.		
9.	Doors, including door handles and door frames	Clean and disinfect.		
10.	Light switches and fittings	Clean and disinfect.		
11.	Windows inside, window sills and frames	Clean and disinfect.		
12.	Vertical surfaces, including drawer fronts, wardrobe doors	Clean and disinfect.		
13.	All ledges, flat surfaces and tops of wardrobes, inside drawers, cupboards, wardrobes	Clean and disinfect.		
14.	Furniture, e.g. bedside cabinets, upholstered chairs and footstools, over bed tables	Clean and disinfect hard surfaces, steam clean soft surfaces, e.g. upholstery.		
15.	Bed, headboard, frame including under mattress and mattress, bed rails and bumpers	Clean and disinfect. Both sides of the mattress should be cleaned, checking the cover for visible signs of tears and staining, unzip and check inside cover and foam mattress for stains. If evidence of staining, mattress and cover should be replaced.		
16.	Radiators and radiator covers	Remove radiator cover. Clean and disinfect cover and radiator.		
17.	Skirting boards	Clean and disinfect.		
18.	Carpet	Vacuum followed by steam cleaning or carpet cleaning machine.		
19.	En-suite	Clean and disinfect all surfaces, e.g. soap dispensers, paper towel holder, bathroom cabinet, shelving, bath/shower, shower curtain and rail/door, taps, sink, hand rails, toilet handle, raised toilet seat, toilet, toilet roll holder, waste bin. Ensure you work from the cleanest area to the dirtiest area.		
20.	Wash bowl (discard if scratched or damaged)	Clean and disinfect.		
21.	Flooring - washable	Clean and disinfect.		
22.	Stock	Restock room with consumables, e.g. paper towels, PPE.		
23.	Make bed	Make the bed with clean linen.		
24.	Hang curtains	Hang clean curtains if they have been removed.		
25.	Documentation	Complete, sign and date document.		

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
