I am writing in response to your recent request that we received on 26 October 2020 in which you requested the following information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Information Requested

I have a couple of important questions to ask the council.

1, What is the definition of a, a patient?, b, a hospital ? and c, patient discharge?

2, If you are a NHS patient is ALL healthcare FREE at the point of need? YES or NO 2a, Does this include health and social care if that person is disabled chronically sick? YES or NO

4, Is there a difference in providing free healthcare for short term patients and long term patients? YES or NO

4a, Does a long term inpatient, patient under the NHS pay the councils care charges? YES or NO

5, Is NHS physiotherapy free in hospital, in the community at a persons home? YES or NO

5a, Is NHS physiotherapy paid by the council social services? YES or NO

6, Do long term patients have to pay for NHS healthcare? YES or NO

7, Do NHS inpatients under NHS care need to complete a DST Decision support tool? YES or NO

8, When does somebody become a NHS patient?

9, When does somebody cease to be a NHS patient?

10, If somebody is an inpatient is that healthcare or social care?

11, If NHS healthcare is FREE at the point of need, that person is a patient under the care of the NHS, does that person cease to be the responsibility of social services and that person cannot fund that person? YES or NO
