

Capacity Tracker Changes

As of Friday 15 January, the below questions have been added to help prioritise delivery of COVID vaccinations and monitor vaccinations against numbers of residents and staff. Guidance on these new questions if required is available through this link.

- Have the COVID-19 vaccination team attended?
- If no, is a visit booked?
- Is a further visit from the COVID-19 vaccination team required?

We're aware that some homes are still having issues with completing the workforce/flu vaccination/COVID vaccination fields. If you haven't updated these figures you will receive contact from either the CCG or the national Capacity Tracker Helpdesk to help guide you through completing them. A reminder that the top box "Total number of residents in home today" and the workforce table have to be completed first in order to fill in vaccination figures, as these figures must add up or they won't save. For example if you enter than you have 25 residents today, the number who have had the COVID vaccination and number who haven't must also equal 25. An automated counter has been added to the tracker to help with this.
