## **COVID Vaccine FAQ's for Care Homes and Care Setting Staff**

North Yorkshire County Council have produced a useful <u>set of answers to</u> <u>frequently asked questions</u> that you and your staff may have around the COVID vaccination.

These provide answers to a number of questions including:

- Why should I get the COVID-19 vaccine?
- I'm worried that the vaccines aren't safe
- What are the side effects of the COVID-19 vaccine?
- If I've already had COVID-19, why do I still need to have the vaccine?
- Why haven't I been invited for a vaccination yet?



### **Pulse Oximetry Update**

Please find through this link a <u>poster</u> that has been created to help staff when using pulse oximeters, including how to use them, how to interpret the readings and what you should do based on these readings. There is also information regarding evidence that pulse oximeters may underestimate blood oxygen levels in individuals with darker skin. A baseline oxygen saturation should be taken when first assessing SpO2 rates and any changes in readings then compared to this baseline

We are working on creating a dedicated pulse oximetry page on the Partners in Care website so this information is easily accessible for staff. This will also link to further information and resources around Identifying and Responding to Deteriorating Residents, including the workbook version of the training which many providers have completed.

#### **Partners in Care Virtual Forum**

This week's Partners in Care Virtual Forum, will take place on **Thursday 28 January from 2.00-2.45.** These sessions are designed to provide support with the latest guidance, updates from across health and social care and a chance to ask questions of both health professionals and fellow care sector colleagues.

## Data Security Protection Toolkit (DSPT) Update

The DSPT is the online data security self-assessment tool which enables providers to demonstrate compliance with the information governance part of the Health and Social Care Act. This mandatory for care providers with an NHS standard contract and recommended for other providers.

We have been informed that after 19 February 2021, the "Entry Level" stage of the DSPT will no longer exist and will be replaced by "Approaching Standards". Providers can still publish at Entry Level up until this date and this will count as their submission for 20/21.

There are only 11 questions to answer for Entry Level (those providers who have already started answering some of the Entry Level questions may still have 14 questions), so this may be a preferable option for some providers, rather than having to work towards Standards Met which has 45 questions. Approaching Standards will replace Entry Level and although not yet confirmed, we are expecting there will be approximately 26/27 questions to answer. In addition,

providers are required to submit a plan on how they seek to complete the rest of the evidence items to meet Standards Met.

The regional DSPT team from NHS England and Improvement are offering Entry Level support sessions based upon demand and will be able to offer each session to a maximum of 10 providers. ## Capacity Tracker Vaccination Reminder

For care homes who access the Capacity Tracker, please can you ensure you update it with vaccinations information as soon as possible after COVID vaccinations have taken place, regardless of whether they were undertaken in a care setting, hospital or other setting.

CCGs need your help to be able to ensure we can access the next round of doses without having to request supplies. The Capacity Tracker is the data sourced being used to evidence the roll out of the vaccination programme and will be used to inform the roll out of the second doses on a national level. Therefore it is essential that the CCGs can access up to date information to inform these arrangements.
