Your Request for Information

I am writing in response to your recent request that we received on 7 December 2020 in which you requested the following information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Information Requested

I am doing a course about medicine management and my assignment is creating a prescribing formulary for a drug named bempedoic acid to treat uncontrolled primary hypercholesterolaemia. I want an estimated statistics for people with hypercholesterolaemia and an estimation on how many of these people have uncontrolled hypercholesterolaemia. Besides, whether you could also provide me with figures on how many patients are having proprotein convertase subtilisin kexin 9 (PCSK9) inhibitors treatment at York Hospital so I can use this figure to do an economic analysis.

Response

I can confirm NHS Vale of York Clinical Commissioning Group does not hold the information you have requested.
