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Community Resources and Approaches for Parents with Learning Disabilities Study

This research project being led by the National Institute for Health Research is aiming to explore how community resources and community-centred approaches can help parents with learning disabilities. We want to find out about community resources that are available in York, Calderdale, Kirklees and about the characteristics of community resources and community-centred approaches that are useful for parents. This information will help a range of organisations adapt their services for parents with learning disabilities. In the longer term, this project will inform future research to identify evidence-based approaches to support parents with learning disabilities.

If you are a professional who works with or has worked with parents with learning disabilities, and/or uses community-centred approaches as part of your work, then they would love to speak to you about your experiences via interview and/or as part of a focus group. They would also like to hear about any parents you know who you think would be interested in taking part. COVID-19 Vaccination and Guidance Updates

 COVID Vaccination First Dose Access- Currently there are some fluctuations in the supply of first doses expected in the coming days and weeks. This is not unusual for a vaccine programme of this size. This does mean that when you try to book your first appointment, you may not find appointments available in York immediately. You may be offered a quicker appointment outside the city, or you can wait a little time until an appointment in York is available. Thank you for your continued patience and understanding as the vaccine is being rolled out as quickly as possible. You can find out more and book you vaccine through the <u>national booking portal</u>.

- Visiting Social Care Settings. <u>Guidance</u> on testing for adult social care settings has been updated to include a letter to record your UON for visitors completing LFD tests at home prior to visiting. <u>Care home visiting</u> <u>guidance</u> has been amended to clarify that all named visits should complete LFD test the same day as visiting.
- The DHSC MCA/DoLS pandemic <u>guidance</u> has been updated (27 April) to reflect the easing of restrictions in England and Wales. In particular, the guidance has been updated in relation to the discharge of functions by people under DoLS as follows (with a similar approach to IMCAs and RPRs in the <u>additional guidance</u>)
