### **Visiting Out of Care Homes- Supplemented Guidance**

The guidance on <u>visiting out of care homes</u> has been supplemented in a <u>separate document</u> released on 4 May, to include guidance on circumstances where residents can go out the home without needing to isolate on return. All existing guidance on screening, testing and nominated visitors, risk assessments still apply ahead of the resident going out. It is the responsibility of the person escorting the resident to ensure social distancing and any mitigations put in place as part of the planning to reduce risk
