## North Yorkshire Safeguarding Adults Board Consultation

One of the North Yorkshire Safeguarding Adult Board's strategic priorities is to raise awareness and develop strategies and address the risk of abuse. This priority's focus remains on **safeguarding being everybody's business** and to achieve this it is important that we raise public awareness so that communities as a whole, alongside professionals, can play their part in preventing, identifying and responding to abuse and neglect.

One of the ways we can do this is to provide information and support in accessible ways to help people understand the different types of abuse, how to stay safe and how to raise a concern about the safety and wellbeing of an adult.

And so throughout 2021 they will be carrying out engagement across North Yorkshire to find out what people know about the NYSAB and safeguarding, what information would help them understand safeguarding and their responsibility in keeping safe and reporting abuse and / or neglect and also find out what people want to tell us and how they want us to show we have listened.

They hope by engaging with lots of people they can do a number of things:

- Review and update the suite of resources and information we share with people so they know how to keep themselves and others safe
- Continue to look at ways we can work together to co-produce accessible information for all with both the public and professionals
- · Strengthen our engagement across North Yorkshire
- Make sure our engagement is meaningful
- · Listen to what people want and act on it

The feedback they receive will help understand and identify the best ways to communicate, engage with and listen to people about safeguarding across North Yorkshire.
