

Addressing the Dementia Diagnosis Gap - Memory Service Referrals

Led by our Clinical Lead, Dr Sara Humphrey with support from Dr Rod Kersh, Consultant Community Physician, these sessions form an important part of the Dementia and Older Peoples Mental Health Programme.

What is it about?

Nationally there has been 32% drop in referrals to Memory Assessment Services MAS between September and October 2021. The aim of this session is to have a conversation about current issues and challenges in this area and how places can support improvement.

We hope to facilitate a discussion about the various factors that may be affecting identification of memory problems and referrals into MAS, including families and friends seeing less of each other during COVID and pressures on services leading to a reduction in face to face appointments.

We hope you will join us to discuss current issues and challenges and those actions/enablers that could help.
