Walk in COVID Booster Vaccinations for Social Care Staff

You will be aware of the national push to encourage as many people as possible to receive their COVID Booster Vaccination, to help combat the increase in prevalence of the new Omicron variant. We're aware that there have been difficulties for staff in accessing appointments flexible to their working hours, so it has been agreed that designated walk in clinics will be set up to allow social care staff to access their booster vaccines (as well as for any yet to receive first and second doses).

To access this staff must bring a proof of employment (such as work photo ID badge). Where possible we would advise staff still to book appointments as there is potential for longer queues depending on demand for walk in's, but the service is designed to provide a more flexible option for access. Details of all the walk in clinics available including dates and opening times can be found through this link, which will be regularly updated as clinics are added.

Telemedicine Service- Expressions of Interest

Eligible older person's care homes will have received contact regarding the opportunity to take up an offer of a 24/7 telemedicine service funded initially for 12 months. The service run aims to compliment the current support you receive from the health system and offers an alternative method in accessing timely advice and intervention. There has been interest from a significant number of homes who are now being contacted by the service provider Immedicare and on their way to getting the service up and running, however there are a still a number of homes who haven't provided a response. Nationally there has been 32% drop in referrals to Memory Assessment Services MAS between September and October 2021. The aim of this session is to have a conversation about current issues and challenges in this area and how places can support improvement. Awards to Recognise Exceptional Practice in Adult Social Care Workforce

Earlier in the year Deborah Sturdy (Chief Nurse for Adult Social Care in England) launched an awards scheme to celebrate and recognise all those in adult social care who go above and beyond their everyday roles to provide excellent care, leadership and inspiration. Senior support worker Paul Evans from The Lodge Care Home in Hemingbrough (run by Action for Care) was one of the first people in the country to receive this award earlier in the year, and was nominated by his manager for going above and beyond in support of those in his care. During the early stage of the pandemic Paul stayed away from home to minimise the risk to his residents, and supported a gentleman at end of life in a bedside vigil as well as being asked to be a pallbearer at the funeral by his family. As well as his work within the home supporting those with learning



disabilities, he also acts as a communication champion within the community which has included setting up a deaf hub and supporting homelessness services. A big congratulations to Paul on receiving his silver award on behalf of the CCG, and for all his work to support and keep safe those in his care. If any other providers have staff members who have recently received an award we would love to hear about them and share their achievements with others.
