#### **Telemedicine Service- First Homes Going Live This Week**

Limetree House will be the first home from the area to go live through the CCG's funded telemedicine service initiative on Monday, with a further 7 homes expected to complete their training this week and also be able to begin using the service. ### **Capacity Tracker Updates**

From **Monday 24 January**, care homes will be asked to record additional information around the closure reasons against each bed type that is marked closed to admissions. There will also be minor changes to the validation for COVID booster vaccinations. We will keep providers updated of any changes as they arise, with the system being reviewed given recent national guidance changes. Thank you for all providers for continuing to update the tracker, which is an invaluable resource in allowing the CCG and partners to support providers.

# ClaroCom App- Now Available on CCG Tablets

Following a request by a provider, the ClaroCom app has now been added to all CCG care provider tablet devices. The app helps to replace speech for those with impairments in the production of spoken language. It is suitable for adults with some or full literacy, and can assist users who have limited or no speech and language difficulties. To download the app you will need to press the "F4IT" button and look under the app catalogue. For any other apps you would like to add to the tablets please don't hesitate to get in touch.



#### **Carers Awareness Training- York Carers Centre**

York Carers Centre are offering a series of training sessions designed for those who encounter and support carers in a professional capacity. The sessions offer an introduction to York Carers Centre and how they can identify and support unpaid carers, and is designed to:

- Increase understanding of carers, their role and its effect on their lives.
- Opportunity to explore how we as professionals working in the health and social care field can help to: identify carers early; recognise them as 'partners' in care; help carers to maintain their own health and wellbeing.

The session will include a presentation, have brief introductions, share information around current carer issues (such as Covid-19/isolation), engage in discussions, include a quiz and share links to carer films on YouTube. #### Access to COVID Vaccination for Social Care Providers

Care homes with a Nimbuscare lead GP Practice (All City of York and Pocklington area practices) are able to arrange catchup visits from the vaccination team. Homes are eligible if they have more than 5 staff and residents who require any of these vaccinations (COVID 1st/2nd doses, COVID Booster or Flu). To arrange a visit please email:

<u>nimbuscare.help.desk@nhs.net</u>. This offer will be open until the end of March so can take account of those currently unable to receive a vaccination due to positive test.

# Reminder- LAMP Testing for Entry to Care Homes

Following feedback that some care homes haven't been aware of this, please find a letter circulated in November on behalf of the CCG and York and Scarborough Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust. This details revised guidance for NHS professionals working for the Trust in visiting care homes, which was strengthened following **Department** of Health and Social Care guidance in order to reduce risks from visits by NHS professionals. Entry should be granted providing one of the below is satisfied:

 Care homes should see evidence from the professional of a negative rapid lateral flow test within the last 72hrs, which shows they are following the NHS staff testing regime

#### or

 NHS professionals visiting care homes should be granted entry if they have a negative test result as part of regular weekly staff testing using LAMP technology. This bulletin is produced by NHS Vale of York Clinical Commissioning Group.
