Changes to COVID-19 Guidance for Adult Social Care Providers-Summary and Webinars

Capacity Tracker Update

Please note that from **this evening**, the following amendments will be made to questions care homes are asked through the Capacity Tracker. These have been made following feedback to ensure only information is still required is collected, and to reduce time taken to complete. The domiciliary care/supported living questions are remaining under review, and the only change at this stage will be removal of flu vaccination questions.

• Care homes are asked to continue updating bed vacancy information **daily**, as this makes a big difference in supporting rapid discharges from hospital into the community.

• The following fields will be removed altogether- Flu vaccination, IPC questions, operating status, testing, training requirements and clinical support questions.

• The remaining questions are now required to be updated **weekly**, which includes a new field added to reflect residents who have received their spring booster dose. They are used by ourselves and your local authorities to target support to those requiring it, and used nationally to understand challenges faced by the sector.
