NHS England and Improvement are hosting a North East and Yorkshire wide workshop, which may be of particular interest for those from general practices who work with care homes.

They are inviting people to share your thoughts on what they can improve and add to the Enhanced Health in Care Homes (EHCH) Framework. The NHS Long-Term Plan made a commitment to the national roll out of the EHCH framework to all care homes in England by 2024. A key priority for the EHCH programme this year is to refresh the framework to ensure we capture the different ways of working that the pandemic enabled and best practice from these changes; and to ensure recommended best practice in the framework is up to date.

The Data Security Protection Toolkit (DSPT) is the online self-completion assessment that care providers are asked to complete to demonstrate

compliance with how they are handling data in line with the Data Protection Act and CQC requirements. All care providers who contract with the NHS are required to complete the toolkit, and once it is published the only requirement is to check your submission annually and republish. For those providers who completed the 20/21 toolkit, you will need to republish by **30 June 2022**. If you completed to Approaching Standards level previously, you will need to publish at Standards Met this time.

If you are unsure if any further action is needed for your service you should receive a flyer through the post to notify you, or can also check yourself through the [DSPT website](#). There is a wide range of support including workshops, resources, videos and 1:1 support available through the regional DSPT Team for all who would find that beneficial.
