

# **Summer Olympic Update Week 7- New Closing Date**

### **Trevor's Story**

Throughout this year's competition we've seen plenty of examples of the meaning and importance that sports and physical activity can have for people, as well some of the personal stories behind this for those receiving care as well as staff across our region. The Orchard's in Northallerton have put this at the centre of their event, by creating a brilliant display based around the achievements of their tenant Trevor, who has kindly have agreed we can also share his inspiring story.

In his youth Trevor was a speedway racer, and also did a lot of fundraising for both the Bedale swimming pool and The Dales Centre. In 1968 Trevor joined Northallerton Motor club and began competing at local events. In his first year he received the most improved rider of the year award for grass track and he was so over the moon with this. Later in February 1976, Trevor received his contract to ride speedway for Halifax which he thought was a great achievement.

That same year Trevor went to Halifax speedway and competed against the likes of Ivan Mauger from New Zealand (a six time world champion). Trevor's International Speedway Team captain was Kenny Carter, who was also a great rider and became speedway world champion in 1977.

On 13th June 1976, Trevor went to Pickering grass track to race, Trevor was in the lead and unfortunately he came off his bike. Another rider was close behind Trevor and didn't have anywhere to go when Trevor came off his bike and resulted in the other riders bike riding over him. The other rider also came off his bike and broke his collar bone.

Following Trevor's accident he was in intensive care for six weeks unconscious and spent a lot of time in hospital, finally getting discharged in the September 1976. Trevor then went to Catterick Military for physiotherapy were he learnt to walk again. Trevor's accident ended his racing career just as Trevor was getting

established, but Trevor still enjoys watching the racing on the television.
