

End of Life Care

Credits: 30 Master's level credits

Starting date: September 2022

Closing date: 31 July 2022



This course is aimed at professionals who work in the field or have a particular interest in palliative and end of life care, as well as those working with individuals living with life limiting illnesses. It will provide you with an opportunity to consolidate and enhance your knowledge and understanding of effective palliative and end of life care.

- The course is aligned with the End of Life Core Skills Education and Training Framework (NHS England).
- It has been developed in partnership with Kirkwood hospice.
- Learning will be focused upon enhancing your knowledge, skills and the essential attributes required to drive high quality care for individuals with palliative care needs, whilst also encompassing the care and support of families and those important to them in a variety of health and social care settings

Throughout your studies emphasis will be placed upon the holistic assessment of the individual and the development of management plans from which optimum end of life care can be delivered. Legal and ethical requirements will also be examined within the context of end of life care and their implications for practice.

Course structure

In order to ensure flexibility, you will be taught through a blended learning approach.

Teaching consists of two days on campus teaching and online learning.

Fees

This course may be eligible for funding from Health Education Yorkshire and the Humber. You must have your employer's support in order to access to a funded place. Employers can draw on CPD funding to fund this course. Detailed guidance on such funding arrangements is available in their funding guide.

If you are not eligible for funding, the tuition fee to study this course in 2022/23 entry is £1,320. Tuition fees will cover the cost of your study at the University as well as charges for registration, tuition, supervision and examinations.

Entry requirements

Entry requirements for this course are normally:

- You must be a Health or Social Care Practitioner, registered with a professional body such as the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) with at least 12 months post-registration employment.
- Have an honours degree at 2:2 or above, have studied at honours level or can demonstrate appropriate knowledge and skills at honours degree standard. We will consider other qualifications and experience on an individual case basis.

If your first language is not English, you will need to meet the minimum requirements of an English Language qualification. The minimum for IELTS is 6.0 overall with no element lower than 5.5, or equivalent will be considered acceptable.
