Preparation for Autumn Vaccination Programme and Building Vaccine Confidence

Ahead of the upcoming Autumn COVID-19 booster campaign which is likely to begin in September, care providers can find <u>useful guidance here</u>, including <u>consent forms for staff</u> and <u>residents</u>. Capacity Tracker- ASC Mandatory Submission Reminder

A reminder that this week marks the first requirement by DHSC/CQC of all providers to complete the Capacity Tracker at least once monthly within the period 8th-14th each month. Providers who haven't completed will receive automated reminders from the system, and are able to access support through the national helpdesk as required. They have arranged daily further training dates for both care homes and domiciliary care as a refresher to those who need it. Details can be found through these slides.
