Join in a Week of Inspiring Events to Launch York's Dementia Strategy

A packed programme of inspiring dementia-related activities has been published to launch York's new Dementia Strategy.

Any resident or organisation affected by, interested in or working with people living with dementia is warmly welcomed to join in the week of events. The activities, information events, training sessions and performance are being run from **26-30 September** by members of the city's dementia partnership to mark the publication of 'Dementia Together'. The partnership includes the Alzheimer's Society, Dementia Forward, York Health and Care Partnership, York Minds & Voices, and Healthwatch.

The programme offers a wide variety of events which reflect the strategy's key themes of Preventing Well, Diagnosing Well, Supporting Well, Living Well and Dying Well. These range from addressing positive mental health to dementia care training; home technology to support for young-onset dementia diagnosis; support for families and carers, a theatrical workshop on dementia in the LGBT community, to making paper birds and a group bike ride. At venues including the Priory Street Centre, Acomb Garth Community Care Centre, Marjorie Waite Court and New Earswick Folk Hall, there will be sessions for residents, professionals and volunteers, as well as seminars with GPs, and specialist mental health providers TEWV. The City Walls will be lit up purple to mark the week of events and the launch of 'Dementia Together'.

Excellence in Collaboration- Dietetic Services and Care Providers

A big congratulations to the York Dietetics Project Team, who were the winner of this year's Excellence in Collaboration award at York and Scarborough Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust's annual awards- which took place last week. This award recognises a unique collaboration between the Trust's dietetic service and Primary Care Networks in Selby and District, which has radically improved the health of elderly residents as well as reinforcing the vital role of dietetics in improving nutrition. The team under dietician Nikki Sumpter worked with many of the care homes in the area, including Abbey Lea and Westwood who embraced this pilot and also attended the awards to celebrate together. This work supported providers and their staff to increase their knowledge around diets and nutrition, and equipped them to implement different ideas on how to add calories and protein to residents diets. Our Nursing Team were also involved with this pilot and are delighted that the impact it has had on empowering providers has been recognised. Capacity Tracker- Workforce Question Changes

From Wednesday 28 September it is anticipated that in response to feedback and to highlight pressures over the winter period, new workforce related questions are being added to Capacity Tracker for both care home and home care providers. There will also be two new questions about packages of care for home care providers. Appropriate help text for these new questions will be available within Capacity Tracker.

For both <u>care home and home care providers</u>, new questions about <u>workforce</u> will be:

• How many hours have you paid direct employees to work in the last month/four weeks*, including any overtime?

• How many hours of overtime have you paid for in the last month/four weeks*?

• How many hours of agency staff time have you paid for in the last month/four weeks*?

• How many days/hours* of absence have you recorded in the last month/four weeks*?

*Time period optional to suit working practice, e.g. could cover last complete pay period using payroll data in recognition that pay periods will differ between or even within providers (some staff will be paid weekly and others fortnightly or monthly) and no one pay period option will be meaningful to all.

For <u>home care providers</u> only, new questions about <u>packages of care</u> will be:

• In the last 28 days, how many current NHS and LA funded service users' care packages have you had to return?

• In the last 28 days, how many current self-funded service users' care packages have you had to end?

These questions refer to previously agreed packages that have been returned/ended after service provision started.
