#### Older Adults Category- 1st Place

The Orchards Champions in Northallerton take our first overall trophy, impressively finishing in the podium positions of all but one event! This includes gold medals in distance race, chair basketball, paper plate discus and the paper strow blow. A massive congratulations to all staff and residents who fully got into the Olympic spirit, including celebrating the value sport can have for those in our care- Creating a display telling the personal story of former speedway racer Trevor.



### Older Adults Category- 2nd Place

- Biggest Achievement by a Staff Member Award- Omega Oak Barn near Kirkbymoorside measured the most steps walked by their staff in an hour whilst on duty, with the winner Gemma clocking up an impressive 4000

- **Biggest Olympic Display-** The Orchards in Northallerton creating a fantastic display showcasing the story of resident Trevor, who was a national level speedway racer
