New Continence Screening Tool- Training Sessions

York and Scarborough Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust are in the process of introducing a new screening tool, to replace the current continence questionnaire/assessment which is completed by district nursing for those in receipt of residential care.

The new Screening Tool can be completed by the Resident or Carer, before involving the District Nurse.

Half hour virtual training sessions are available to support providers in utilising the tool, and staff from any care setting are welcome to attend a session to cascade in a "train the trainer" model. ENRICH Update

The <u>ENRiCH register</u> (Enabling Research in Care Homes) is free to join, and brings together care homes, residents and researchers to support research, by inviting your Care Home to participate in a variety of studies. There is no obligation for the Care Home team to accept these study invitations unless they find the studies interesting and easy to support. Further information can be found through this <u>link</u>, which includes a list of current studies open to providers. These include:

- Defining and Measuring Safety in Older Adult Residential Care Homes
- The PROTECTOOLKIT Project- Helping identify areas of care that need improvement as well as gain enhanced understanding of the homes preparedness in safeguarding and protecting residents and staff during a pandemic/outbreak
- THE VOICE- Explore care home staff experiences of providing continence care to older adult care home residents
- **RESPOND** Provide a platform for care home staff to be heard and share their experiences of caring for residents that become suddenly unwell.

- Development of core outcome sets for effectiveness trials of interventions to prevent and/or treat delirium (**Del-COrs**)
- **CONTACT** Investigating whether the use of wearable digital contact tracing technology (e.g. bracelet or fob) is more effective than traditional tracing methods in a care setting.
- Promoting good practice in relation to alcohol use in care homes for older people
- Care, Migrant Workers and COVID-19- Experiences during the pandemic.
