Funding Available- Implementation of Digital Social Care Records and Sensor-Based Falls Technology (Available to Care Homes)

The Digitising Social Care programme is a place based approach, with funding to be used for delivery and care home digitisation. This funding will support increasing digitisation within social care by enabling the adoption of care technologies that will enhance the quality, safety, and efficiency of social care. This is solely for the implementation of new Digital Social Care Records from a supplier on the NHS Assured Supplier List and Sensor-Based Falls Technologies. Ongoing costs will need to be picked up by providers.

In order to be eligible for the funding providers need to engage with the DREaMS Team, if they haven't already, to establish their current Digital Maturity Level. Providers will then be issued an application form to request funding for a product supplying quotes to ensure validity. There will then be an approval process and upon successful applications the provider will have to sign a contract before release of funding, it has an agreement to ensure an invoice is submitted after implementation. This will prove appropriate spend and will provide transparency and auditable trails of expenditure and outcomes.

Yorkshire and Humber Webinar: Building Vaccine and Screening Confidence Training Programme

Health Education England are running a workshop for Autumn/Winter vaccination The primary objective of the Autumn booster programme this year will be to increase protection against severe COVID-19 disease for those at higher risk. The skills training covers:

- How can we work together to build vaccine confidence, what we know and how this links to health inequality
- Core skills and processes (OARS, Evoke-Provide-Evoke, Decisional Balance, and the 3As)
- Skills practice Building confidence in the vaccine
- Resources that staff can use to respond to questions and concerns The session will be interactive.

Care Provider Forums Across North Yorkshire and York Going Forward- Your Chance to Share Your Thoughts

As a local health and social care system we are committed to working together to provide joined up support to all our care providers and their staff. This includes regularly holding providers forums, which from feedback we know you have found really valuable opportunities to stay up to date with important updates, raise any burning issues and ask questions of both fellow providers and health/social care services.

There are currently three such groups covering slightly different geographies across our patch (Care Connected, Partners in Care, and North Yorkshire Provider Forum). We are proposing to combine these into a single group run jointly by North Yorkshire County Council and NHS Humber and North Yorkshire Integrated Care Board, to allow providers to come together to hear all relevant updates across both health and social care at the same time and avoid having to attend multiple meetings. This will be open to all care providers from across North Yorkshire and York.

Additionally, we will continue to have attendance and input from other partners such as the Independent Care Group, Skills for Care and other services that

work with and support providers. We will continue to share out the slide packs and resources from all sessions so all providers are able to access them. We have developed the below proposal following an initial survey however want to ensure any future group is shaped around what you as provider colleagues want to see. Therefore, we would really value any feedback you would be happy to provide on this proposal in order for us to tailor it to the needs of our care sector as best possible.

Palliative Care Skills Sessions and Palliative Care Clinics-Scarborough and Ryedale/Vale of York Providers

Project ECHO are running a series of palliative care skills sessions over November, which are designed as a supportive ECHO network to enable front line care staff to plan and provide best practice palliative care.
